During the year under review there is a significant change in operating performance as compared to the previous year in terms of sales, productivity and product mix, since there has been drastic dropdown in turnover and also there has been loss during the period under review as compared to profit in previous year.

5. Material Changes and Commitments

No material changes and commitments affecting the financial position of the Company occurred between the end of the financial year to which this financial statement relates and the date of this report.

6. Adequacy of Internal Financial Controls with reference to Financial Statements

The Company has in place adequate internal financial controls with reference to financial statements. During the year under review, such controls were tested and no reportable material weakness in the design or operation was observed.

7. Maintenance of cost records

The Company is not required to maintain cost records as per Section 148(1) of the Companies Act, 2013.

The Company does not have any Subsidiary, Joint Venture or an Associate Company.

9. Statutory Auditors

Biswas Dasgupta Dutta & Roy, Chartered Accountants were appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the Company from the conclusion of Annual General Meeting held on 30.09.2019 to hold office for a period of five years till the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting to be held in the year 2024, at such remuneration as may be decided by the board in consultation with the Auditor.

Biswas Dasgupta Dutta & Roy, Chartered Accountants has audited the books of accounts of the Company for the financial year ended 31st March, 2024 and has issued the Auditors' Report thereon. There are no qualifications or reservations on adverse marks or disclaimers in the said report. Further, there are no frauds has been reported by the Auditors to the Audit & Compliance Committee or the Board under Section 143(12) of the Companies Act, 2013.

Further, since the term of existing statutory auditors are expiring at the ensuing Annual General Meeting, your director's propose to appoint statutory auditors who shall hold office from the conclusion of ensuing Annual General Meeting till the conclusion of Annual General Meeting to be held in the year 2029.

The Board of Directors of the Company are of the opinion that the Independent Directors appointed during the year, are a person of integrity and having relevant expertise and experience including the proficiency required to perform their roles effectively as an independent director of the Company.

20. Number of meetings of the Board of Directors

During the financial year ended 31st March, 2024, 6 (six) meetings of the Board of Directors of the Company was held on the following dates: 30.05.2023, 14.08.2023, 04.09.2023, 30.09.2023, 14.11.2023 and 14.02.2024. The maximum time gap between two board meetings did not exceed 120 days.

21. Compliance with Secretarial Standards

The Company has complied with the Secretarial Standards issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India on Board Meeting and General Meeting.

22. Committees of the Board

Currently, the Board has three committees: the Audit Committee, the Nomination and Remuneration Committee, and the Stakeholders' Relationship Committee.

23. Committees:

The Audit Committee of the Board of Directors meets the criteria laid down under Section 177 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Regulation 18 of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirement) Regulation, 2015 in the terms of reference to the Audit Committee. As on 31st March, 2024 the committee consisted of 3 members. The Committee met four times a year.

The Nomination and Remuneration Committee and the Stakeholders' Relationship Committee is also constituted by the Company. The meeting of Nomination and Remuneration Committee was held only once and meeting of Stakeholders' Relationship Committee was held only once.

24. Nomination and Remuneration Policy

The Nomination and Remuneration Policy formulated by the Nomination and Remuneration Committee of the Company is in conformity with the requirement of Section 178(3) of the Companies Act, 2013 and Listing Regulations. The objectives and key features of this Policy are:

- Formulation of the criteria for determining qualifications, positive attributes and independence of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel and Senior Management Personnel;
- Devising a policy on Board diversity;
- Identifying persons who are qualified to become Directors and persons who may be appointed in Key Managerial and Senior Management positions in accordance with the criteria laid down in this policy;
- Formulation of criteria for performance evaluation of the Board, its Committees and Directors including Independent Directors / Non-Executive Directors; and Recommend to the Board all the remuneration in whatever form, payable to the Senior Management.

The guiding principles of the Policy are:

- The level and composition of remuneration is reasonable and sufficient to attract, retain and motivate Directors of the quality required to run the Company successfully;

- Relationship of remuneration to performance is clear and meets appropriate performance benchmarks; and
- Remuneration to Directors, Key Managerial Personnel and Senior Management involves a balance between fixed and incentive pay reflecting short- and long-term performance objectives appropriate to the working of the Company and its goals.

25. Details of establishment of vigil mechanism for directors and employees

Pursuant to sub-section (9) & (10) of section 177 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with rule 7 of the Companies (Meetings of Board and its Powers) Rules, 2014, the Company has established a Whistle Blower Policy (Vigil mechanism) for Directors and Employees of the Company to report their genuine concerns or grievances. The Audit Committee as empowered by the Board of Directors to monitor the same and to report to the Board about the complaints in an unbiased manner.

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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

Regulation 34 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 stipulates disclosure under specific heads which are given in the following paragraphs and which continue to be followed in the usual course of the Company's business over the year in discussion amongst the Directors and Senior Management Personnel.

INDUSTRY STRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENTS

The Tea crop period ranges from March to December. The crop yield depends on the weather conditions. The area under plantation is constant and as such the yield depends to a large extent on irrigation facilities, better soil management techniques etc. Necessary steps are initiated by the Company for improving the yield and quality of crop in its gardens. Steps are initiated by the management for increasing the crop yields by implementing necessary improved agricultural practices. This is very essential for the growth and betterment of the industry.

The Company is laying more stress on improving the quality and has commenced use of better compost in the plantation areas for sustaining the quality of soil as well as for improving the yield. The Company adopts good tea plantation practices to maintain the yield and has embarked on production of quality teas.

OPPORTUNITIES AND THREATS

The Company's major income is from sale of tea. The tea manufactured by the Company is sold through auctions as well as private sales. The production cost of tea, comprises of various inputs which are statutorily required to be met by the Company including those under the Plantation Labour Act, Minimum Wages Act etc and levies imposed by the Central and State authorities from time to time under various other laws. Thus, after meeting the costs, the industry is left with a very small margin to meet its other expenses for sale of product. Unpredictable weather conditions and shortage of labour are the main threats to the industry.

SEGMENT-WISE OR PRODUCT-WISE PERFORMANCE

The Company's main business is manufacturing. Tea which is sold through auction centres and as bulk / private sales and is covered under the sections 'Financial Results' and 'Operations' respectively in the Directors Report.

OUTLOOK:

Tea being a common man's drink is consumed widely throughout the country. Weather is of prime importance for Tea manufacturing industry for achieving the production target for the industry. Due to vagaries of the weather the production of tea fluctuates within a given range.

However, in spite of this scenario to the outlook for the tea industry appears to be good, due to its increasing demand and consumption.

RISKS AND CONCERNS

The Management has to constantly monitor the risks and concerns associated with the industry by ensuring adequate irrigation facilities to the Plantation areas, soil enrichment, protection of plantation against attacks by pests etc. and is also subject to changing market conditions and the trends.

Besides climatic conditions, global production, the rising growth of bought leaf sector, shortage of labour during peak season, increase in wages and other costs could affect the fortunes of the Tea Industry.

INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEMS AND THEIR ADEQUACY

The Company has an effective system of internal control commensurate with its size and it ensures operational efficiency, accuracy in financial reporting and compliance of applicable laws and regulations at all levels of Management of the Company. These are reviewed from me to me and improved upon, where required. The different sets of auditors periodically visit the Company's units, their reports are looked into by the Management and by the Audit Committee for effecting corrective action/improvement as may be called for.

MATERIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN HUMAN RESOURCES / INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS FRONT INCLUDING NUMBER OF PEOPLE EMPLOYED

The Tea industry is labour intensive and provides employment to a very large segment of the local population. The company presently has one tea estates located in the State of West Bengal. As on 31st March, 2024 the Company provided employment to about 942 employees including workers, staff and sub-staffs.

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of Eximpo Tea Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024, the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended on that date, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the standalone financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2024, its loss or profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date, except for matters which have included in the Basis of Opinion paragraph.

Basis for Opinion

We have conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the standalone financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. Our opinion is otherwise not modified, except for the issues mentioned below -

- 1) Actuarial Gains & losses could not be ascertained and the immediate effect of the same in the financial statement cannot be ascertained;
- 2) Interest payable on account of delay in payment of gratuity to the employees of the company has not been given effect to in the financial statement and accordingly the resultant effect on the profit/loss of the company cannot be ascertained.
- 3) Provision for impairment loss on loans and advances made to Utkarsh Galva Limited has not been made, resulting in understatement of losses to the extent to which such provisions not made;

Material Uncertainty Related to Going Concern

We draw attention to Note -31 in the financial statements, which indicates that the Company incurred a net loss of Rs 4.61 crores during the year ended March, 2024 and, as of that date, the Company's current liabilities exceeded its total assets by Rs 9.15 crores. These events or conditions, indicate that a material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.



Key audit matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the standalone financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the standalone financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters. We have determined the matters described below to be the key audit matters to be communicated in our report.

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Management Discussion and Analysis, Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, Business Responsibility Report, Corporate Governance and Shareholder's Information, but does not include the standalone financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. The Report of the Director is expected to be made available to us after the date of the auditor's report.

Our opinion on the standalone financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the standalone financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the standalone financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Management's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance, total comprehensive income, changes in equity and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the AS and other accounting principles generally accepted in India.

1. General Information

EXIMPO TEA LIMITED [CIN: U15491WB1985PLC038494] is primarily engaged in growing and manufacturing of tea. The company has its registered head office at Sir E.N. Mukherjee House 3B, Lalbazar Street, Kolkata WB -700001. The company has its tea estate at P.O. Bannagar, Banarhat, Jalpaiguri, WB-735202.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

2.1 Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements of the Company are prepared in accordance with Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principle (Indian GAAP) under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis. GAAP comprises mandatory Accounting Standards as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the provisions of the Act (to the extent notified). Accounting policies have been consistently applied except where a newly issued accounting standard is initially adopted or a revision to an existing accounting standard requires a change in the accounting policy hitherto in use.

2.2 Property, Plant and Equipments

Fixed Assets have been valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Fixed Assets have been stated at cost inclusive of incidental expenses incurred in connection with the acquisition / installation thereof.

Cost of Plantation of banyan plants are spread over a period of 60 years and charged to depreciation in statement of profit and

2.3 Depreciation

Depreciation on Tangible Fixed Assets have been provided to the extent of depreciable amount on straight line method on pro-rata basis based on the useful life of the assets prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

2.4 Investments

Investments being long term in nature are stated at cost. A provision for diminution, if any, is made to recognise a decline, other than temporary, in the value of investments.

2.5 Inventories

Finished Goods being Tea is valued at Cost or net realisable value whichever is lower.
Stores, Spares Parts and Foodstuff are valued at Cost on FIFO Basis.

2.6 Revenue Recognition

Revenue from sales of tea and others is recognised on the basis of receipt of documents confirming sales.
Interest income is recognised on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the interest rate applicable.

2.7 Employee Benefits

(a) Short Term Employee Benefits

All employee benefits payable wholly within twelve months of rendering the services are classified as short-term employee benefits. These benefits include compensated absences such as paid annual leave and sickness leave. The undiscounted amount of short-term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees is recognised during the year.

(a) Long Term Employee Benefits

The company makes specified monthly contributions towards Employee Provident Fund and ESI Fund managed by the Government which is charged to Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.8 Taxes on Income

Current tax is determined as the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income for the period. Deferred tax is recognised, subject to consideration of prudence in respect of deferred tax assets, on timing differences, being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax asset is recognised only if there is virtual certainty that future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets will be realized. Such assets are reviewed as at each Balance Sheet date to reassess realisability thereof.

2.9 Earnings per share

The Basic and Diluted Earnings per share has been computed by dividing the net attributable profit to the equity shareholders by the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year.

2.10 Cash Flow Statement

Cash Flow Statement has been prepared under the indirect method as set out in Accounting Standard - 3. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

2.11 Provisions and Contingent Liabilities

The Company creates a provision when there is present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. When there is a possible obligation or a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.
